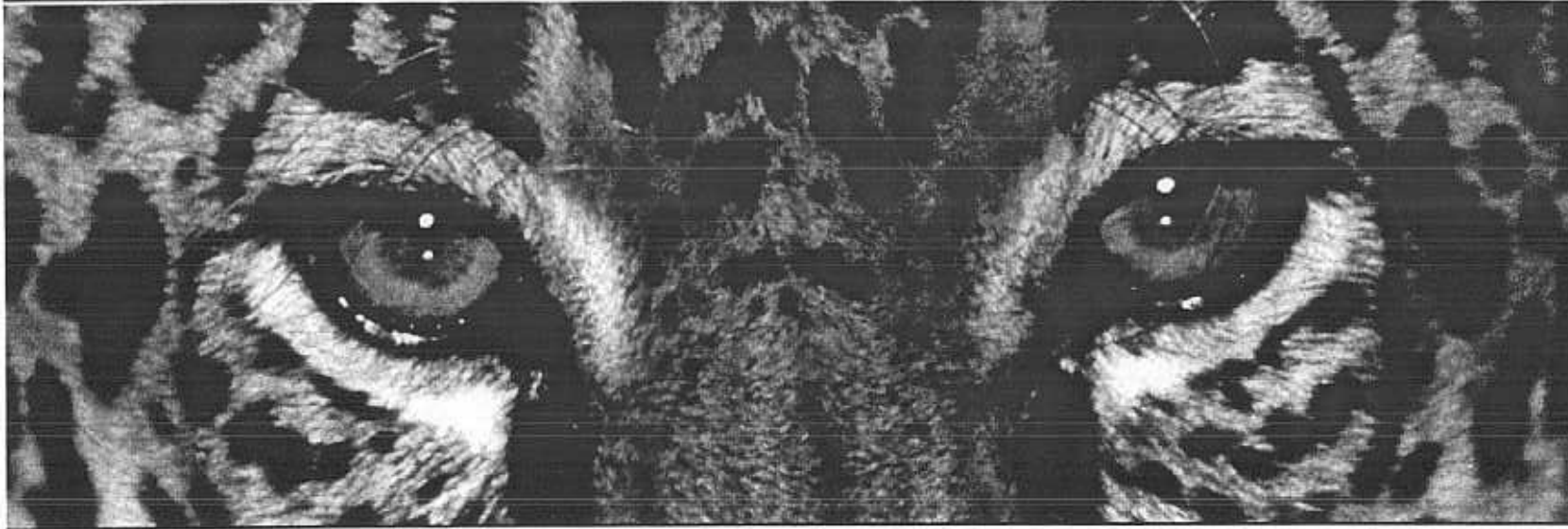


Look her
